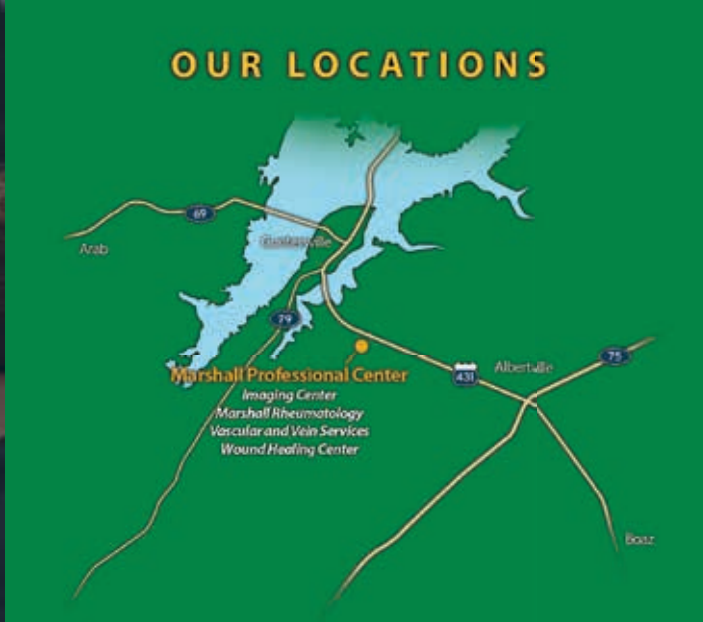

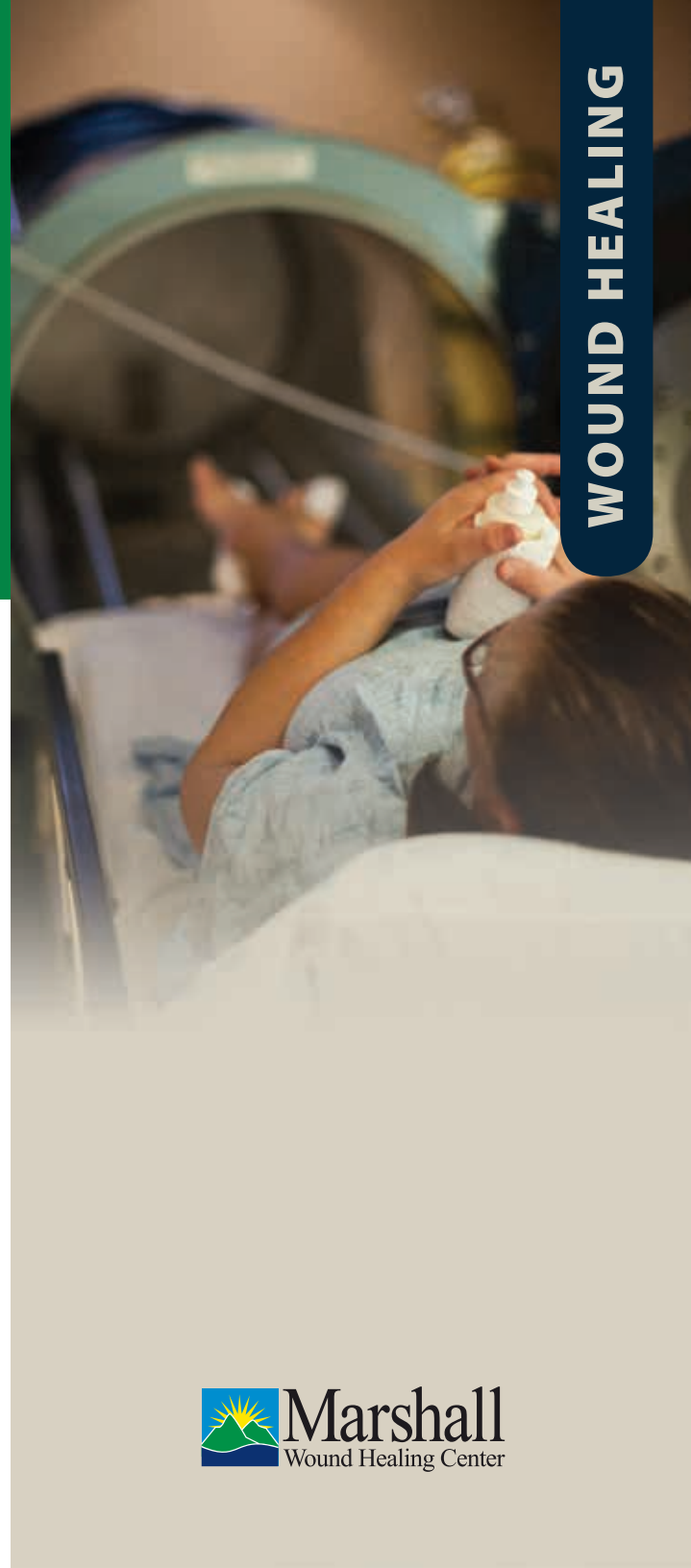

WOUND HEALING



The Wound Healing Center offers many specialized therapies to help you heal faster.

Why do some wounds need specialized care? There are many medical conditions that can affect the body's ability to heal wounds. Slow-healing wounds are a serious health issue. From limiting your mobility to an increased risk of infection, an open sore can quickly become more than an inconvenience. If you have a history of non-healing wounds or coexisting medical conditions, seek specialized wound care right away. Our staff has special training in wound science, and we offer many treatment options. From hyperbaric oxygen therapy to specialized wraps and dressings, we match the right therapy to your specific situation. Slow-healing wounds shouldn't be ignored – let us put you on the fast track to recovery.

How to Start Healing:

- 1.** Call us directly. If your insurance requires a referral, we can reach out to your doctor and/or healthcare provider.
- 2.** When you call, we will ask you a few questions about your wound and your health in general.
- 3.** During your visit, our medical team will thoroughly evaluate your wound and health history.
- 4.** Tests may be conducted to tell us more about your blood flow as well as to determine if the wound is infected.
- 5.** Once your wound has been evaluated, your medical team collaborates to create your individualized plan of care.
- 6.** We will keep your primary doctor informed throughout your care. Once your wound is healed, you'll return to your doctor for follow-up care.



What is Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy?

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy (HBOT) is a treatment that increases the amount of oxygen in your blood. It has been used for more than 70 years to improve healing in tissues deprived of oxygen. Studies show it significantly improves healing for some types of chronic wounds.

How Does HBOT Work?

- Patients lay inside a clear-sided chamber filled with 100% oxygen that is pressurized.
- The pressure is not uncomfortable.
- Blood-oxygen levels increase by nearly three times. This helps tissue growth.

How Do I Know if HBOT is Right for Me?

Ask your doctor to evaluate your wound and consider any coexisting medical conditions that affect your ability to heal.

What to Bring to Your First Appointment:

- A list of all medications you are taking as well as any known allergies.
- Medical records including test results.
- Insurance cards and form.
